- Jackie Robinson was born in Cairo, Georgia in 1919.
- Jackie Robinson played baseball, basketball, football, and track in college.
- After college, Jackie Robinson served in the army during World War II.
- Major League baseball was <u>segregated</u> when Jackie started playing in 1945. Only white players could
 play on the Major League Baseball teams.
- In 1945, Jackie Robinson had to play in a league for only African Americans, Kansas City Monarchs.
- Jackie Robinson was the first African American to play for the Dodgers which was an all-white Major League team in 1947.
- It takes courage to change things that are unfair or wrong. Jackie Robinson was willing to be the first African American to play for Major League Baseball.
- Jackie Robinson showed good sportsmanship because he did not fight or argue with players or fans who
 were mean to him and did not want him to play with the Dodgers.
- Jackie Robinson was a very good player for the Dodgers. He was named Rookie of the Year and won the Most Valuable Player.
- Jackie Robinson was elected into the Baseball Hall of Fame in 1962.
- In 1997, Jackie Robinson's uniform number, 42, was retired which means no other Dodger player could wear that number in honor of Jackie Robinson.
- Like MLK, Jr, Jackie Robinson showed <u>civility</u>. Civility means treating others with respect and kindness.
