- The governor is the leader of the state.
- Taking care of water, air, and the land was important to Jimmy Carter. As president, he worked hard to help pass laws that protected the environment.
- As president, Jimmy Carter helped create a peace treaty between the leader of Egypt and the leader of Israel.
- In 2002, Jimmy Carter won the Nobel Peace Prize for his efforts in trying to keep peace among people and countries.
- Compassion is caring about other people. Jimmy Carter always tried to help people who needed help.
- Jimmy Carter worked hard volunteering for <u>Habitat for Humanity</u> which builds homes for people in need.
