- What was MLK, Jr.'s dream? He wanted equal rights for all people no matter what the skin color was
- MLK, Jr. encouraged people to use peaceful ways to solve problems. What award did MLK, Jr.
   win in 1964 for his work in promoting peace? Nobel Peace Prize
- In 1964, a law was passed to end segregation in public buildings thanks to MLK, Jr.'s hard work.
- How did MLK, Jr. die? MLK, Jr. was shot and killed in 1968 by a man who did not like the changes he was trying to make.
