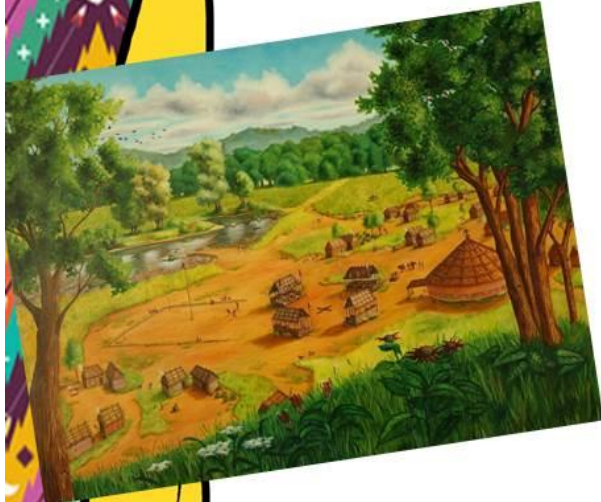


Creek & Cherokee Villages

There was a meeting house.

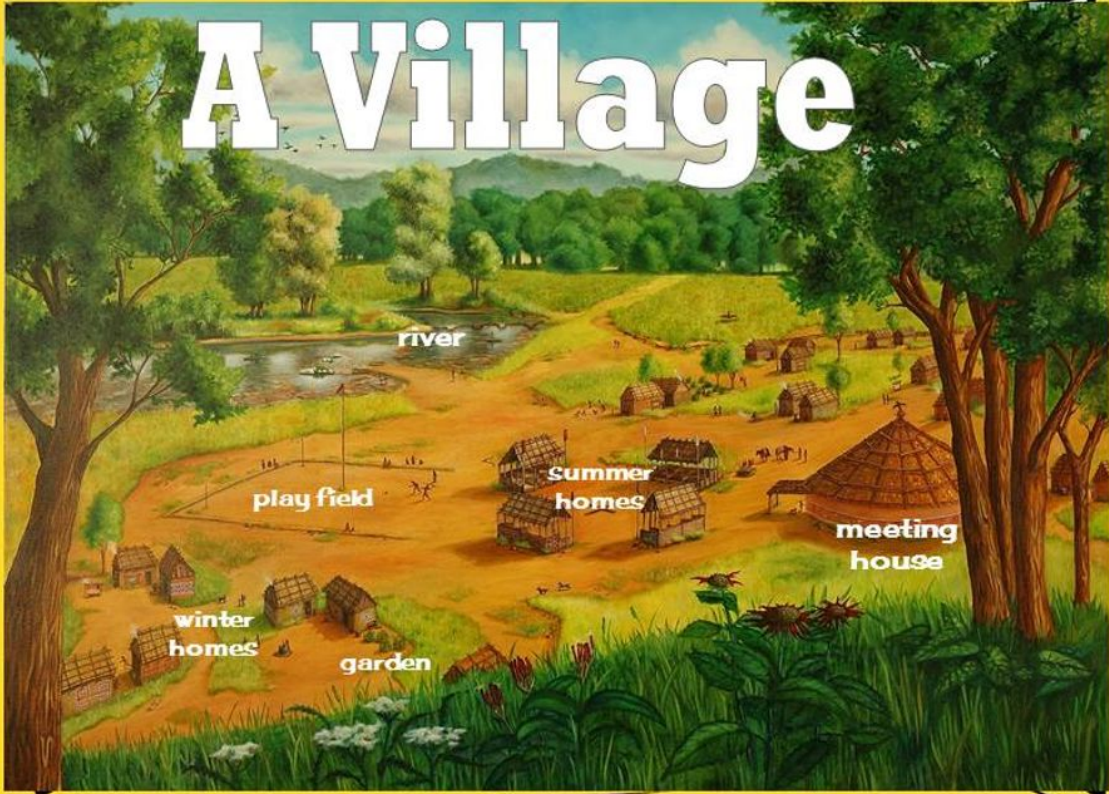
Most families had a home with a garden behind it.

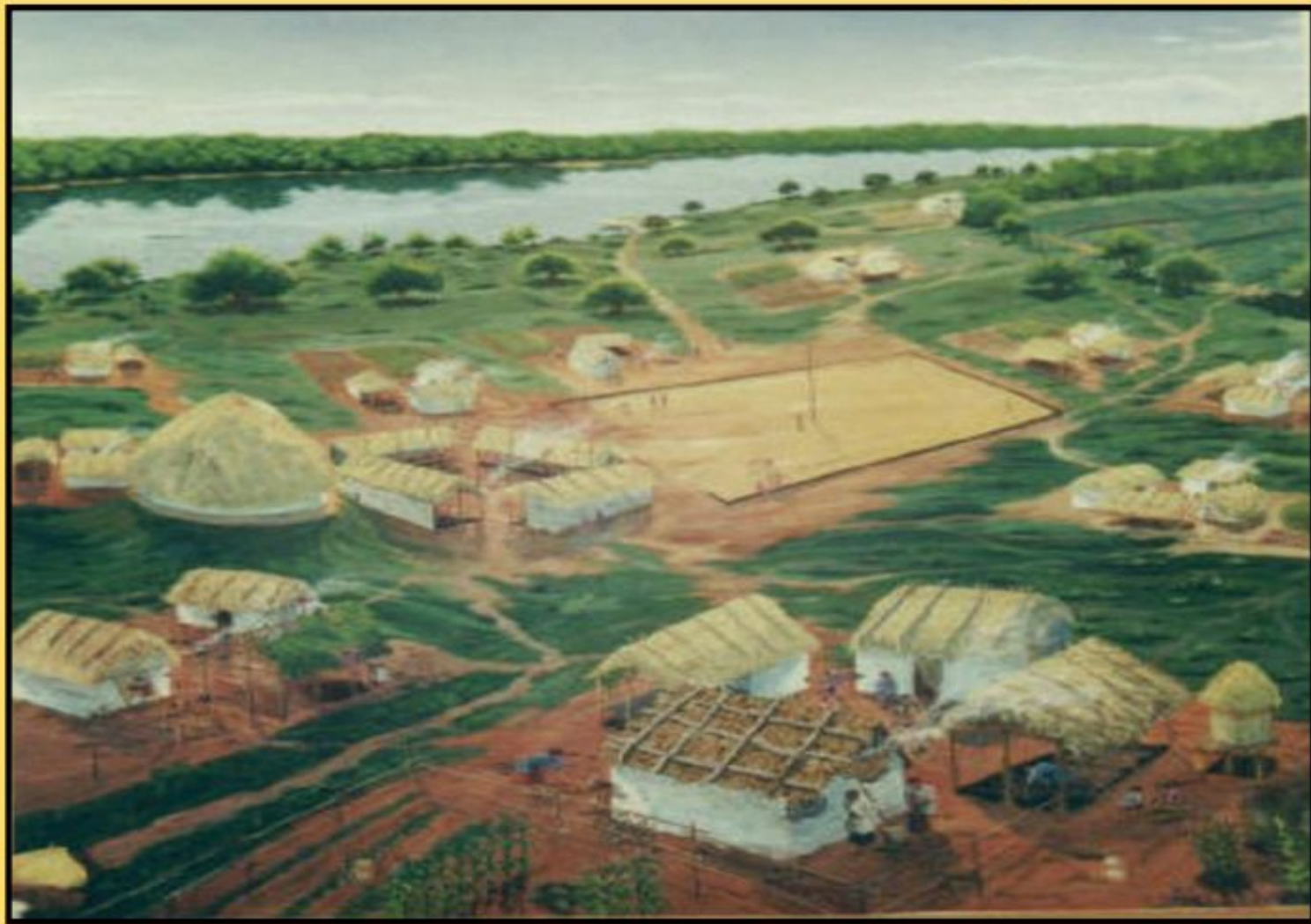

The Creek & Cherokee built their homes from mud and sticks.

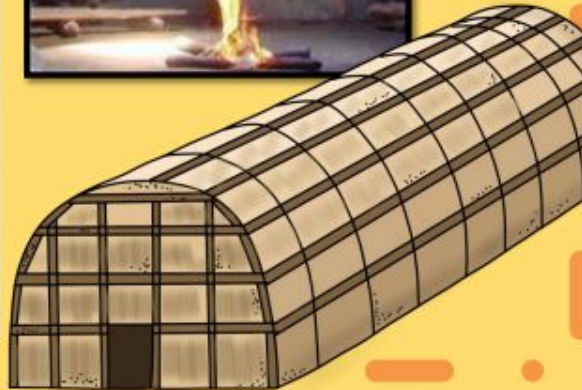
They had a thatched (grass-made) roof.

Most had a winter home, with 4 walls (left in picture) and a summer home, with no walls (right in picture).

Homes were build from nature:
sticks, mud. Summer homes had no
walls.

The Cherokee and Creek Homes

- They built their homes of **wattle and daub**.
wattle - branches and twigs, woven together
daub - mud used to cover the wattle
- Most had two homes. Their winter homes were about as warm as a log cabin.
